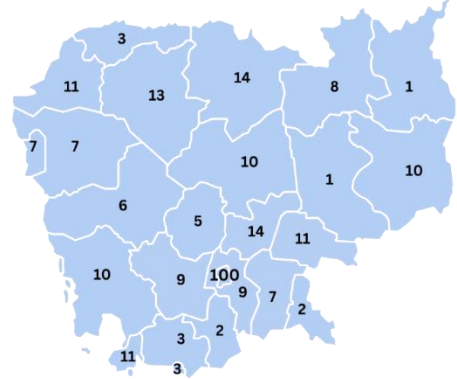


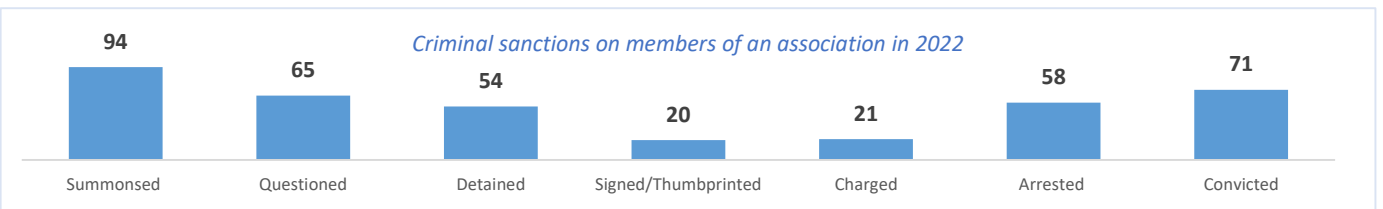
Freedom of association – January to December 2022 (Year Seven)

The Fundamental Freedoms Monitoring Project (FFMP) is a multi-year project that systematically monitors the ability of Cambodians to exercise the freedoms of association, expression, and assembly. This dashboard presents the key findings regarding the freedom of association from the FFMP's Seventh Annual Report. In 2022, the FFMP recorded 277 restrictions to the right to freedom of association, **148** of which amounted to a violation of this right. Phnom Penh saw the highest number of incidents, many of which were related to the NagaWorld worker strike.

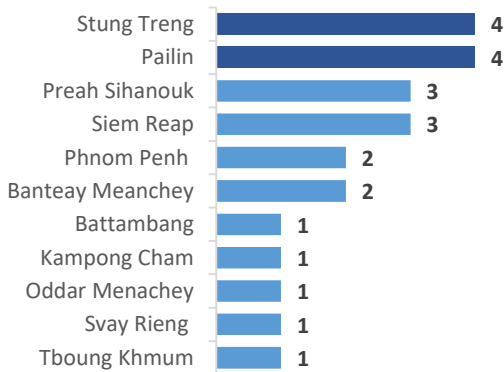
Geographical mapping of incidents involving a restriction or violation of the right to freedom of association



In 2022, the FFMP recorded 58 arrests, 71 convictions, and 54 detentions for crimes allegedly committed while exercising the freedom of association. 17 of the 21 individuals charged and 60 of the 71 individuals convicted were former members of the now-dissolved Cambodia National Rescue Party.

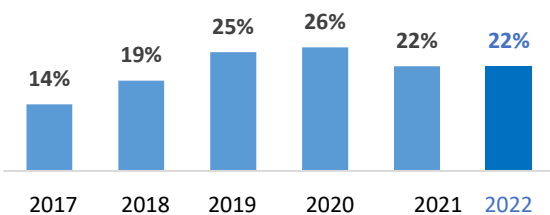


Political opposition parties could not freely exercise their freedom of association during the commune election

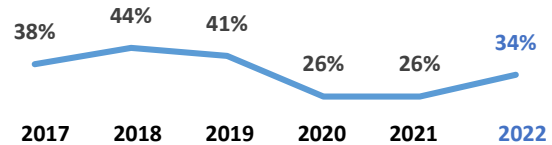


Number of incidents interfering with political opposition billboards by provinces

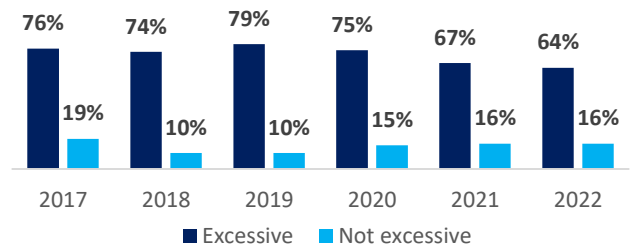
Percentages of respondents who stated being targeted due to their involvement in an association
